Carol Boles is suffering from blood clots in the lungs after a hip replacement and a broken leg resulting from getting in the car from the hospital. Rose Rodriguez has had knee surgery and is on crutches. Cy Crosby has been in and out of the hospital from other complications. Let's keep all of them in our prayers.

As of this writing, we are well into the Alameda County Fair event. Our club members really have participated by demonstrating in the Hobby building for wood carving and holding the Soap Carving Competition event for the Kid's on Fridays. There was a lot of interest and conversation from the fair goers with our Demo Folks. Wood carving entries for the adults started out with only 19 entries. The director, responsible for entries, called for more carvings and we really came forth with the majority of the carvings. The club members did well on the cabinet presentation winning first place.
